At a meeting of the County Commissioners for the County of Norfolk held at Dedham within and for said county on the fifth day of October 1926, by adjournment of their September Meeting next preceding; The petition of Kenneth D. Johnson and others, of Milton in said county represents as follows; Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Norfolk ss. To the Honorable the County Commissioners of the County of Norfolk; Respectfully represent your petitioners inhabitants of the town of Milton in said county, that common convenience and necessity require that the way known as Hillside Street, a public way in said town be relocated between the Milton-Canton line and a point near the parking space on Houghton's Pond Reservation for the purpose of establishing the boundary lines of said way, making alterations in the course and width of said way, making repairs on said way as are deemed necessary. Wherefore your petitioners pray that said way may be relocated within the limits above specified. Dated July 21, 1926.

This petition was presented to the commissioners and duly entered at a meeting of said commissioners held at Dedham aforesaid on the twenty-seventh day of July 1926, by adjournment of their June Meeting next preceding and the thirty-first day of August then next, and 10.30 o'clock in the forenoon at the Court House in said Dedham were appointed by the commissioners as the time and place for commencing to view the premises and they thereupon caused a copy

of said petition and of this order thereon to be served upon the clerk of the town of Milton being the town within which such relocation of way was prayed for, thirty days at least before the time appointed for said view, and also caused copies of said petition and order to be posted in two public places in said town and also gave notice to all persons interested by causing a like copy to be published three weeks successively in the Milton Record a newspaper published in said county, said posting and the last publication of said copy having been fourteen days at least before the time appointed for said view that all persons and corporations interested for or against said petition might then and there appear and be heard if they saw fit. And on the thirty-first day of August the commissioners, Evan F. Richardson, Edward W. Hunt and Frederick A. Leavitt met at the time and place specified in said order when and where the petitioners appeared, and the town of Milton was represented by its selectmen and the said commissioners then viewed the route and premises and heard all persons and corporations interested and no party interested objected and said hearing was then continued and adjourned to a meeting of the commissioners held at Dedham aforesaid on the twenty eighth day of September by adjournment of their June Meeting next preceding when and where the said commissioners proceeded to consider and adjudicate upon the prayer of said petition and thereupon the said commissioners did adjudge that common convenience and necessity require that said way be relocated as prayed for in said petition. And thence the same was continued and adjourned from time to time to this meeting. And now the said commissioners by courses and distances, metes and bounds do relocate said Hillside Street as prayed for in said petition. And the lines of said relocation of said Hillside Street are as follows; The northerly line begins at a stone bound in the Canton-Milton town line at a point distant 28.85 ft. northerly from a town bound on the northerly side of Blue Hill Street in Canton and said Hillside St. in Milton and being in the northerly line of said Blue Hill Street as laid out on even date herewith, thence easterly and southerly by a 900 ft. radius curve 395.53 ft. to a stone bound, thence S. 62-55 E. 208.8 ft. to a stone bound, thence by a 900 ft. radius curve to the left 501.48 ft. to a stone bound, thence N. 85-09-30 E. 770.4 ft. to a stone bound, thence by a 1400 ft. radius curve to the left 258.6 ft. to a stone bound, thence N. 74-34-30 E. 133.53 ft. to a stone bound, thence by a 1100 ft. radius curve to the right 517.08 ft. to a stone bound, thence S. 78-29-30 E. 536.6 ft. to a stone bound, thence by a 500 ft. radius curve to the left 246.36 ft. to a stone bound, thence continuing by the same curve 246.36 ft. to a stone bound. The southerly line begins at the point of beginning of the northerly line, thence S. 25-27-E. 114.55 ft. in the Canton-Milton town line to a stone bound at

the easterly end of the southerly line of Blue Hill Street, Canton, as laid out on even date herewith, thence easterly and southerly by an 800 ft. radius curve 298.92 ft. to a stone bound, thence S. 62-55 E. 208.8 ft. to a stone bound, thence by a 1000 ft. radius curve to the left 278.60 ft. to a stone bound, thence continuing by the same curve 278.60 ft. to a stone bound, thence N. 85-09-30 E. 770.4 ft. to a stone bound, thence by a 1500 ft. radius curve to the left 277.07 ft. to a stone bound, thence N. 74-34-30 E. 133.53 ft. to a stone bound, thence by a 1000 ft. radius curve to the right 470.08 ft. to a stone bound, thence S. 78-29-30 E. 536.6 ft. to a stone bound, thence by a 600 ft. radius curve to the left 295.63 ft. to a stone bound, thence continuing by the same curve 295.64 ft. to a stone bound, said bound bearing S 44-57-15 E. 100 feet from the last bound in the northerly line as above described. Said lines are shown upon a plan entitled "Plan showing the relocation and widening of Hillside Street, Milton, from the Canton town line about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile easterly as made by the Norfolk County Commissioners, October 1926, Hartley L. White County Engineer, Scale 1 inch-40 ft." and marked "Evan F. Richardson, Chairman." And the said commissioners do hereby take for the purposes of a highway all the lands included within the lines of relocation hereinbefore described and as shown on the plan hereinbefore referred to and made a part hereof in so far as such lands may lie outside the limits of said way as heretofore defined. And permanent stone or concrete bounds not less than three feet long two feet of which at least shall be inserted in the earth will be erected at the termini and angles of the way relocated as aforesaid when practicable, and when not so, a heap of stones, a living tree, a permanent rock or the corner of an edifice will be a substitute or said bounds may be permanent stone or concrete bounds not less than three feet long with holes drilled therein and filled with lead placed a few inches below the travelled part of the street or way. And it is determined by the Commissioners that the Inhabitants of the Town of Milton do within one year from the date of this return and order complete said way in a thorough and workmanlike manner and to the acceptance of the County Commissioners. Said way shall be constructed to the full width indicated on said plan, throughout the entire length of the portion relocated by this return and order. Suitable sidewalks, gutters, culverts, retaining walls, fences and railings shall be constructed wherever needed. And it is determined by the Commissioners that all the expenses of making the relocation of way prescribed in this return and order including the expenses of constructing said way, and all land and other damages and expenses incident thereto, be paid by the Inhabitants of the Town of Milton; and that the County of Norfolk shall pay to the Inhabitants of the town of Milton the sum of Eight Thousand Eight

Hundred Fifty-four Dollars (\$8854), payment thereof to be made at such time as the commissioners may determine, having regard to the amount of the work done and the proportion of the expense to be paid by the County.

And the Commissioners have heard the proprietors of lands and property, rights and interests, taken or affected by these proceedings, and have considered and estimated the damages sustained in the premises, having had regard to all the damages done to the parties respectively, whether by taking their property or injuring it in any manner, and having allowed, by way of set off, the benefits, if any, to the property of said parties in the premises, and do estimate and determine the damages to be paid to said parties respectively, in the sums hereafter named; the same to be paid to said parties respectively by the Inhabitants of the town of Milton when the lands hereby taken and over which said way is hereby located, have been entered upon and possession taken, for the purpose of constructing said way.

And having heard the proprietors of lands and property, rights and interests, taken or affected by these proceedings, the Commissioners direct that all said proprietors shall have the right to take off their timber, wood, and trees and to remove their buildings structures, hedges, walls, and fences from the lands so taken, at any time within three months from the date when said lands have been entered upon or possession thereof taken for the purpose of constructing said way.
