Norfolk, ss. At a meeting of the County Commissioners for the County of Norfolk, held at Dedham, within and for said County, on the sixteenth day of July 1929, by adjournment of their June meeting next preceding: The petition of Wilfrid N. Dufresne and others, of Bellingham in said County, represents as follows: Commonwealth of Massachusetts Norfolk, ss. To the Honorable the County Commissioners of the County of Norfolk: Respectfully represent your petitioners, inhabitants of the town of Bellingham in said County, that common convenience and necessity require that the way known as Paine Street, a public way in said town, be relocated between Wrentham Street and the Woonsocket City Line for the purpose of establishing the boundary lines of said way, making alterations in the course and width of said way, and making repairs on said way. Wherefore your petitioners pray that said way may be relocated within the limits above specified. Dated Dec. 10, 1928.

This petition was presented to the Commissioners and duly entered at a meeting of said Commissioners, held at Dedham, aforesaid, on the eighteenth day of December 1928, by adjournment of their September meeting next preceding; and the twenty-ninth day of January then next and 11:20 o'clock in the forenoon, at the Court House in said Dedham, were appointed by the Commissioners as the time and place for commencing and proceeding to view the premises; and they thereupon caused a copy of said petition, and of this order thereon, to be served upon the Clerk of the Town of Bellingham, being the town within which such relocation of way was prayed for, thirty days at least before the time appointed for said view; and also caused copies of said petition and order to be posted in two public places in said town; and also gave notice to all persons interested, by causing a like copy to be published three weeks successively in the Franklin Sentinel, a newspaper published in said County, said posting and the last publication of said copy having been fourteen days at least before the time appointed for said view, that all persons and corporations interested for or against said petition, might then and there appear and be heard if they saw fit. said twenty-ninth day of January, the Commissioners, Edward W. Hunt, Frederick A. Leavitt and Russell T. Bates, met at the time and place specified in said order. And the said Commissioners heard all persons and corporations interested; and no party interested objected; and thereupon the said Commissioners did did adjudge that common convenience and necessity require that said way be relocated as prayed for in said petition. And thence the same was continued and adjourned from time to time to this meeting. And now the said Commissioners, by courses and distances, metes and bounds, do relocate said Paine Street as prayed for in said petition. And the lines of said relocation of said Paine Street are as follows: The easterly line begins at a stone bound bearing S49-37-40 W 28.85 ft. from the northwest corner and N 50-22-20 W 15.7 ft. from the southwest corner of the dwelling house at the easterly corner of Wrentham and Paine Streets; thence southerly and easterly by a 33.83 ft. radius curve 33.53 ft. to a stone bound; thence by a 2050 ft. radius curve to the right 226.23 ft. to a stone bound; thence continuing by the same curve 226.24 ft. to a stone bound; thence S 24-09-30 E 450 ft. to a stone bound; thence by the same course 380.25 ft. to a stone bound; thence by a 2050 ft. radius curve to the right 240.02 ft. to a stone bound; thence continuing by the same curve 240.02 ft. to a stone bound; thence S 10-44-30 E 176.95 ft. to a stone bound; thence by a 950 ft. radius curve to the left 255.34 ft. to a stone bound; thence S 26-08-30 E 400 ft. to a stone bound; thence by the same course 265.65 ft. to a stone bound; thence by a 522 ft. radius curve to the left 210.64 ft. to a stone bound in the Bellingham-Woonsocket line, said line being also the Massachusetts Rhode Island State line. The westerly line begins at a stone bound in the approximate westerly line of Wrentham Street, said bound bearing S 88-20-15 W 131.60 ft. from the point of beginning of the easterly line as above described; thence easterly and southerly by a 400 ft. radius curve 200.02 ft. to a stone bound; thence continuing by a 2000 ft. radius curve to the right 351.64 ft. to a stone bound; thence S 24-09-30 E 450 ft. to a stone bound; thence by the same course 380.25 ft. to a stone bound; thence by a 2000 ft. radius curve to the right 234.16 ft. to a stone bound; thence continuing by the same curve 234.17 ft. to a stone bound; thence S 10-44-30 E 176.96 ft. to a stone bound; thence by a 1000 ft. radius curve to the left 268.78 ft. to a stone bound; thence S 26-08-30 E 400 ft. to a stone bound; thence by the same course 265.65 ft. to a stone bound; thence by a 572 ft. radius curve to the left 177.48 ft. to the line bound in the said Bellingham-Woonsocket line; thence N 89-00-15 E 71.37 ft. in the said Bellingham-Woonsocket line to the last bound in the easterly line as above described. Said lines are shown upon a plan entitled "Plan showing the Relocation and Widening of Paine St., Bellingham from Wrentham St. to the Woonsocket Line as made by the

Norfolk County Commissioners by Return dated July 16, 1929. Hartley L. White, County Engineer. Scale 1 inch-40 feet" and marked "Edward W. Hunt, Chairman" which plan is filed herewith and made a part hereof. And the said Commissioners do hereby take for the purposes of a highway all the easements and rights incident to a public highway in the lands included within the lines of relocation hereinbefore described and as shown on the plan herebefore referred to and made a part hereof in so far as such lands may lie outside the limits of said way as heretofore defined. And Permanent stone or concrete bounds, not less than three feet long, two feet of which at least shall be inserted in the earth, will be erected at the termini and angles of the way relocated as aforesaid, when practicable; and, when not so, a heap of stones, a living tree, a permanent rock, or the corner of an edifice will be a substitute; or said bounds may be permanent stone or concrete bounds not less than three feet long, with holes drilled therein, and filled with lead, placed a few inches below the travelled part of the street or way. And it is determined by the Commissioners that the Inhabitants of the Town of Bellingham do within two years from the date of this return and order complete said way in a thorough and workmanlike manner and to the acceptance of the County Commissioners. Said way shall be constructed to the full width indicated on said plan throughout the entire length of the portion relocated by this return and order. Suitable sidewalks, gutters, culverts, retaining walls, fences and railings shall be constructed wherever needed. And it is determined by the Commissioners that all the expenses of making the relocation of way prescribed in this return and order including the expenses of constructing said way, and the removal of all buildings, structures, hedges, walls, and fences from the lands taken, and all land and other damages and expenses incident thereto, be paid by the Inhabitants of the Town of Bellingham. And the Commissioners have heard the proprietors of lands and property, rights and interests, taken or affected by these proceedings, and have considered and estimated the damages sustained in the premises, having had regard to all the damages done to the parties respectively, whether by taking their property or injuring it in any manner, and having allowed, by way of set off, the benefits, if any, to the property of said parties in the premises, and do estimate and determine the damages to be paid to said parties respectively, in the sums hereafter named; the same to be paid to said parties respectively by the Inhabitants of the town of Bellingham when the lands hereby taken and over which said way is hereby located have been entered upon and possession taken for the purpose of constructing said way.
