And the lines of said Washington Street are as follows; The westerly line of Washington Street, begins at a stone bound in the northerly line of Summer Street in said Braintree at a point distant 53.7 ft.westerly from the present northerly corner of Summer and Washington Streets; thence easterly and northerly by a 50 ft. radius curve 60.09 ft. to a stone bound in land of the Braintree Savings Bank; thence N 26-13 E, 354.65 ft.to a stone bound; thence by a 15 ft. radius curve to the left 24.90 ft. to a stone bound in the southerly line of Taylor Street; thence N 30-56  $\scriptstyle\rm E$ 32.47 ft.across said Taylor Street to a stone bound; thence easterly and northerly by a 15 ft. radius curve 22.22 ft. to a stone bound; thence N 26-13 E.741.2 ft. to a stone bound in the land of the Town of Braintree; thence by a 16 ft.radius curve to the left 42.72 ft.to a stone bound; thence N 53-15 E.66.56 ft. to an unmarked point near the southerly line of Central Avenue. The easterly line begins at a bound in the easterly line of said Washington Street at a point bearing S.27-29-30 E.150.95 ft.from the point of beginning of the westerly line; thence northerly and easterly by a 1400 ft.radius curve 289.01 ft.to a stone bound; thence N 26-13 E.1043.85 ft.to a stone bound; thence by a 47.75 ft. radius curve to the right 47.75 ft. to a stone bound in the southerly line of Union Street, said bound bearing S 60-20-30 E.60.11 ft.and N.83-31 E.26.09 ft.from the last point in the westerly line as above described. Said lines are shown in red upon a plan entitled "Plan showing the Relocation and Widening of Washington Street, from Summer St., to Central Avenue in the Town of Braintree as made by the Norfolk County Commissioners, Evan F. Richardson, Chairman, December 1925. Hartley L. White, County Engineer, Scale 1 inch - 40 feet". And the said commissioners do hereby take for the purposes of a highway all the lands included within the lines of relocation hereinbefore described and as shown on the plan hereinbefore referred to and made a part hereof in so far as such lands may lie outside the limits of said way as heretofore defined. And permanent stone or concrete bounds, not less than three feet long, two feet of which shall be inserted in the earth, will be erected at the termini and angles of

way relocated as aforesaid, when practicable; and when not so, a heap of ones, a living tree, a permanent rock, or the corner of an edifice will a substitute; or said bounds may be permanent stone or concrete bounds not less than three feet long, with holes drilled therein, and filled with lead, placed a few inches below the travelled part of the street or way. and it is depermined by the Commissioners that the Inhabitants of the Town of Braintree do within two years from the date of this return and order complete said way in a thorough and workmanlike manner and to the acceptance of the County Commissioners. Said way shall be constructed to the full width indicated on said plan, throughout the entire length of the portion relocated by this return and order. Suitable sidewalks, gutters, culverts, retaining walls, fences and railings shall be constructed wherever needed. and it is determined by the Commissioners that all the expenses of making the relocation of way as prescribed in this return and order including the expenses of constructing said way, and all land and other damages and expenses incident thereto be paid by the Inhabitants of the Town of Braintree. and the Commissioners have heard the proprietors of lands and property rights and interests taken or affected by these proceedings and have considered and estimated the damages sustained in the premises having had regard to all the damages done to the parties respectively whether by taking their property or injuring it in any manner and having allowed by way of set off the benefits if any to the property of said parties in the premises and do estimate and determine the damages to be paid to said parties respecbively in the sums hereafter named; the same to be paid to said parties respectively by the Inhabitants of the Town of Braintree when the lands hereby taken and over which said way is hereby located have been entered upon and possession taken for the purpose of constructing the said way.
