At a meeting of the County Commissioners for the County of Norfolk, held at Dedham, within and for said County, on the fifth day of April 1932 by adjournment of their December meeting next preceding: The petition of Samuel C. French and others, Selectmen of Westwood Commonwealth of Massachusetts Norfolk, ss. To the in said County represents as follows; Honorable County Commissioners of the County of Norfolk: Respectfully represent the selectmen of the Town of Westwood that public convenience and necessity require that a new way be laid out in the town of Westwood across the location of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad, Midland Division, by an underpass at a point about 1700 feet northeast of the present railroad underpass on East Street as measured along said railroad. Dated at Westwood this 23rd day of January 1932.

This petition was presented to the Commissioners and duly entered at a meeting of said Commissioners, held at Dedham, aforesaid, on the second day of February 1932, by adjournment of their December meeting next preceding; and the twenty-third day of February then next and eleven o'clock in the forenoon, at the Court House in said Dedham were appointed by the Commissioners as the time and place for commencing and proceeding to view the premises; and they thereupon caused a copy of said petition, and of order of notice thereon to be served upon the Clerk of the Town of Westwood being the town within which such relocation of way was prayed for, fifteen days at least before the time appointed for said view; and also caused an abstract of said petition and of said order of notice to be posted in two public places in said town; and to be published in the Dedham Transcript a newspaper published in said County, said posting and publication having been seven days at least before the time appointed for said view, that all persons and corporations interested for or against said petition, might then and there appear and be heard if they saw fit. And on the said twenty-third day of February, the Commissioners, Frederick A. Leavitt and Russell T. Bates met at the time and place specified in said order, when and where the petitioners appeared and the said ComPlan Book 115 Plan 150-

missioners heard all persons and corporations interested; and no party interested objected; and said hearing was then continued and adjourned to a meeting of the Commissioners held at Dedham aforesaid, on the fifteenth day of March by adjournment of their December meeting next preceding, when and where said commissioners appointed Tuesday the fifth day of April and eleven o'clock forenoon, at Dedham in said County as the time and place when and where they would proceed to further hear said petition and they thereupon caused notice of said further hearing to be served upon the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad Company fourteen days at least before said fifth day of April 1932. And on said fifth day of April 1932, the said commissioners, Edward W. Hunt, Frederick A. Leavitt and Russell T. Bates heard all parties interested. And now the said Commissioners, by courses and distances, metes and bounds, do lay out said way across the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad as prayed for in said petition. And the lines of said location of said way are as follows: Beginning at a point on the northwesterly location line of said railroad right of way, bearing North 75°19'38" west and 47.12 feet distant from station 647+10.32 and extending thence, following said railroad location line, northeasterly by a curve to the right of 5770.90 feet radius for a distance of 91.34 feet; thence leaving said railroad location line and extending south 17°13'55" east for a distance of 93.99 feet to a point on the southeasterly location location line of said railroad right of way; thence following said railroad location line southwesterly by a curve to the left of 5688,40 feet radius for a distance of 91.75 feet; thence leaving said railroad location line and extending north 17°13'55" west for a distance of 94.83 feet to the point of beginning. Said way shall be constructed by the Department of Public Works so as to cross under said railroad at a point about 600 feet distant northerly of Carroll Avenue, so called, said point being shown on plan as station 647+10.32 of the base line of location of said railroad and station 40+11.57 of the base line of location of the proposed highway. Said lines are shown upon a plan entitled "The Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Plan of Road in the Town of Westwood, Norfolk County As ordered by the County Commissioners, April 5th, 1932, Scale: 40 feet to the inch" which plan is filed herewith and made a part of this return. A suitable bridge is to be built in such manner as not to injure or obstruct said railroad and in accordance with plans and specifications to be prepared by the Department of Public Works. And the said commissioners do hereby take for the purposes of a highway, all the easements and rights incident to a public highway in the lands included within the lines of location hereinbefore described and as shown on the plan hereinbefore referred to and made a part hereof. Suitable sidewalks, gutters, culverts, retaining walls, fences and railings shall be constructed wherever needed.
