Norfolk ss: At a meeting of the County Commissioners for the County-Commissioners ----County of Norfolk, held at Dedham, within and for said County, on the first day of August 1933 by adjournment of their June meeting next preceding: The petition of the Board of Selectmen of Dedhem in said County, represents as follows: Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Norfolk ss:To the Honorable the County Commissioners of the County of Norfolk: Respectfully represent your petitioners, inhabitants of the town of Dedhem in said County, that common convenience and necessity require that the way known as Eastern Avenue, a public way in said town, be relocated between High Street and New State Highway for the purpose of establishing the boundary lines of said way, making alterations in the course or width of said way and making repairs on said way. Wherefore your petitioners pray that said way may be relocated within the limits above specified. Dated May 14, 1933.

Acting in accordance with vote of the town. This petition was presented to the Commissioners and duly entered at a meeting of said Commissioners, held at Dedham, aforesaid, on the sixteenth day of May 1933, by adjournment of their April meeting next preceding; and the sixth day of June then next and eleven o'clock in the forencon, at the Court House in said Dedhem were appointed by the Commissioners as the time and place for commencing and proceeding to view the premises; and they thereupon caused a copy of said petition, and of order of notice thereon, to be served upon the Clerk of the Town of Dedham being the town within which such relocation of way was prayed for, fifteen days at least before the time appointed for said view; and also caused copies of an abstract of said petition and of said order of notice to be posted in two public places in said town; and to be published in the Dedham Transcript, a newspaper published in said County, said posting and publication having been seven days at least before the time appointed for said view, that all persons and corporations interested for or against said petition, might then and there appear and be heard if they saw fit. And on the said sixth day of June the Commissioners Edward W. Hunt, Frederick A. Leavitt and Russell T.Bates, met at the time and place specified in said order, when and where the petitioners appeared, and the town of Dedham was represented by its selectmen, and the said Commissioners then viewed the route and premises, and heard all persons and corporation interested; and no party interested objected; and said hearing was then continued and adjourned to a meeting of the Commissioners held at Dedham aforesaid, on the thirteenth day of June by adjournment of their April meeting next preceding, when and where the said Commissioners proceeded to consider and adjudicate upon the prayer of said petition, and thereupon the said Commissioners did adjudge that common convenience and necessity require that said way be relocated as prayed for in said petition. And thence the same was continued and adjourned to a meeting of the said Commissioners held at Dedham on the twenty-seventh day of June 1933 at eleven o'clock in the forencon, when amd where the commissioners heard all owners of property, to be taken or affected by these proceedings and thence the same was continued to this meeting. And now the said Commissioners, by courses and distances, metes and bounds, do relocate said Eastern Avenue as prayed for in said petition. And the lines of said relocation of said Eastern Avenue are as follows: The westerly line begins at a stone bound in the

northerly line of the new State Highway known as the Providence Turnpike, said bound bearing S-6-11-10-W 26.96 ft.from the southeast corner of the building at the northwesterly corner of Eastern Avenue and said Providence Turnpike belonging to George G. Bradford; thence northeasterly and northerly by a 60.00 ft. radius curve 51.18 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-18-54-30-W 66.14 ft.to a stone bound; thence by a 20.00 ft. radius curve to the left 31.19 ft. to a stone bound in the southerly line of Bryant Street; then beginning at a stone bound in the northerly line of said Bryant Street, said bound bearing N-17-40-35-W 40.00 ft.from the last described bound; thence easterly and northerly by a 20.00 ft.radius curve 30.30 ft.to a stone bound; thence N-15-03-W 31.76 ft. to a stone bound; thence by a 700.00 ft. radius curve to the right 107.24 ft.to a stone bound; thence N-6-16-20-W 22.65 ft.to a stone bound in the present westerly line of Eastern Avenue; thence by the same course and in the said present westerly line 124.24 ft.to a bolt; thence by a 40.00 ft. radius curve to the left 46.37 ft. to a bolt in the present southerly line of High Street, said 40.00 ft. radius curve is not tangent at either end. The easterly line begins at a stone bound in the northerly line of the aforesaid turnpike, said bound bearing N-29-57-40-E 186.76 ft.from the point of beginning of the westerly line as above described; thence southwesterly, westerly, and northerly by a 25.00 ft.radius curve 58.34 ft.to a stone bound; thence continuing by a 1200.00 ft. radius curve to the right 306.48 ft.to a stone bound; thence continuing by a 50.00 ft. radius curve to the right 74.04 ft.to a stone bound; thence N-83-03-00-E 50.02 ft.to a stone bound in the present southerly line of High Street. Said lines are shown upon a plan entitled "Plan showing the Relocation and Widening of Eastern Ave., Dedham between Providence Turnpike and High St., as made by the Norfolk County Commissioners by Return dated Aug.1,1933. Hartley L. White, County Engineer, Scale 1 inch = 40 feet." and marked "Edward W. Hunt, Chairman" which plan is filed herewith and made a part of this return. And the said commissioner's do hereby take for the purposes of a highway all the easements and rights incident to a public highway in the lands included within the lines of relocation hereinbefore described and as shown on the plan hereinbefore referred to and made a part hereof in so far as such lands may lie outside the limits of said way as heretofore defined. And permanent stone or concrete bounds, not less than three feet, long, two feet of which at least shall be inserted in the earth, will be erected at the termini and angles of the way relocated as aforesaid when practicable; and, when not so, a heap of stones, a living tree, a permanent rock, or the corner of an edifice will be a substitute; or said bounds may be permanent stone or concrete bounds not less than three feet long, with holes drilled therein, and filled with lead, placed a few inches below the travelled part of the street or way. And it is determined by the Com missioners that the Inhabitants of the Town of Dedham, do within two years from the date of this return and order complete said way in a thorough and workmanlike manner and to the acceptance of the county commissioners. Said way shall be constructed to the full width indicated on said plan, throughout the entire length of the portion relocated by this return and order. Suitable sidewalks, gutters, culverts, retaining walls, fences and railings shall be constructed wherever needed. And it is determined by the Commissioners that all the expenses

of making the relocation of way as prescribed in this return and order including the expenses of constructing said way, and all land and other damages and expenses incident thereto, be paid by the Inhabitants of the Town of Dedham. And the Commissioners have heard the proprietors of lands and property, rights and interests, taken or affected by these proceedings and have considered and estimated the damages sustained in the premises, having had regard to all the damages done to the parties respectively, whether by taking their property or injuring it in any manner, and having allowed, by way of set off, the benefits, if any, to the property of said parties in the premises, and do estimate and determine the damages to be paid to said parties respectively in the sums hereafter named; the same to be paid to said parties respectively by the Inhabitants of the Town of Dedham when the lands hereby taken and over which said way is hereby located, have been entered upon and possession taken, for the purpose of constructing the said way.
