This petition was presented to the Commissioners and duly entered at a meeting of said Commissioners, held at Dedham aforesaid on the twenty fifth day of January 1938 by adjournment of their December meeting next preceding; and the fifteenth day of February then next, and two fifteen o'clock in the afternoon at the Court House in said Dedham were appointed by the Commissioners as the time and place for commencing and proceeding to view the premises; and they thereupon caused a copy of said petition and of order of notice thereon, to be served upon the Clerk of the town of Westwood being the town within which such relocation of way was prayed for, fifteen days at least before the time appointed for said view; and also caused copies of an abstract of said petition and of said order of notice to be posted in two

And permenent stone or concrete

bounds, not less than three feet long, two feet of which at least shall be inserted in the earth, will be erected at the termini and angles of the way relocated as aforesaid, when practicable; and when not so, a heap of stones a living tree, a permanent rock or the corner of an edifice will be a substitute; or said bounds may be permanent stone or concrete bounds not less than three feet long, with holes drilled therein, and filled with lead, placed a few inches below the travelled part of the street or way. And the Commissioners have heard the proprietors of lands and property, rights and interests, taken or affected by these proceedings, and have considered and estimated the damages sustained in the premises, having hed regard to all the damages done to the parties respectively, whether by taking their property or injuring it in any manner, and having allowed, by way of set off, the benefits, if any, to the property of said parties in the premises, and do estimate and determine the damages to be paid to said parties respectively, in the sums hereafter named; the same to be paid to said parties respectively by the Inhabitants of the town of Westwood when the lands hereby taken and over which said way is hereby located, have been entered upon and possession taken, for the purpose of constructing said way.
