The petition of JOHN E. McCAFFREY and others of WEY-MOUTH, in said County, represents as follows:

To the Honorable the County Commissioners of the County of Norfolk:

Respectfully represent your petitioners, Inhabitants of the Town of WEYMOUTH in said County, that common convenience and necessity require that the way known as Commercial Street, a public way in said town, be relocated between the intersection of School Street, High Street and Commercial Street known as lower Jackson Square and out to the Hingham town line for the purpose of establishing the boundary lines of said way, making alterations in the course or width of said way and making repairs of said way.

Wherefore your petitioners pray that said way may be relocated within the limits above specified.

This petition was presented to the Commissioners and duly entered at a meeting of said Commissioners, held at Dedham,

aforesaid, on the eleventh day of March, 1981, by adjournment of their December meeting next preceding: a notice of said meeting having been posted as required by law: and the eighth day of April, 1981, and two-thirty o'clock in the afternoon at the Selectmen's Meeting Room in the Town Hall in said Weymouth were appointed by said Commissioners as the time and place for commencing and proceeding to view the premises; and they thereupon caused a copy of said petition and of order of notice thereon to be served upon the Clerk of the Town of WEYMOUTH, being the town within which such relocation of way was prayed for, fifteen days at least before the time appointed for said view, and also caused copies of an abstract of said petition and of said order of notice to be posted in two public places in said town: and to be published in the Weymouth News and Gazette, a newspaper published in said County, said posting and publication having been seven days at least before the time appointed for said view, that all persons and corporations interested, for or against said petition, might then and there appear and be heard if they saw fit.

And on the said eighth day of April, 1981, the Commissioners, James J. Collins, George B. McDonald and David C. Ahearn, met at the time and place specified in said order, when and where the petitioners appeared, and the Town of WEYMOUTH was represented by its Director of Public Works; and the said Commissioners then viewed the route and premises, and heard all persons and corporations interested; and no party interested objected, and thence the same was continued and adjourned to a meeting of the Commissioners held at Dedham on the fifteenth day of April, 1981, a notice of said meeting having been posted as required by law, at which time

the said Commissioners did adjudge that common convenience and necessity require that said way be relocated as prayed for in said petition.

And thence the same was continued and adjourned from time to time to this meeting.

And now the said Commissioners, by courses and distances, metes and bounds, do relocate said COMMERCIAL STREET as prayed for in said petition.

And the lines of said relocation of COMMERCIAL STREET are as follows:

The westerly line of Commercial Street begins at a stone bound which is on the present westerly line at the intersection of Broad and Commercial Streets; thence northeasterly and northerly by a 158.48 ft. radius curve, 113.38 ft. to a stone bound; thence $N-17^{\circ}-24^{\circ}-40^{\circ}-E$, 171.32 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 1600.00 ft. radius curve, 360.31 ft. to a stone bound; thence $N-4^{\circ}-30^{\circ}-30^{\circ}-E$, 512.99 ft. to a stone bound which is on the westerly line of Wharf Street; thence N-26°-48'-03"-E, 56.51 ft. to a stone bound which is on the easterly line of Wharf Street; thence N-49°-40°-36"-E, 114.88 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 361.67 ft. radius curve, 239.82 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-87°-40°-10°-E, 63.28 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 230.00 ft. radius curve, 223.46 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-32°-00°-11"-E, 210.00 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 300.00 ft. radius curve, 175.26 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-19°-27°-03"-E, 68.50 ft. to a stone bound; thence continuing on the same course 143.34 ft. to a stone bound; thence continuing on the same course 276.19 ft. to a stone bound; thence

to the right by a 927.42 ft. radius curve, 207.09 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 100,00 ft, radius curvo, 102,60 ft. to a stone bound which is on the westerly line of Clinton Road as laid out by the Town of Weymouth March 3, 1930; thence $N-63^{\circ}-27^{\circ}-36^{\circ}-1$, 40.00 ft. to a stone bound which is on the easterly line of said 1930 Town layout of Clinton Road; thence southeasterly and easterly by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 49.18 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-40°-44'-50"-E, 150.21 ft. to a drill hole in retaining wall; thence to the left by a 15.00 ft. radius curve, 26.56 ft. to a drill hole in retaining wall which is on the side line of Addington Circle as laid out by the Town of Weymouth March 3, 1930; thence N-43°-26'-38"-E, 41.25 ft. across Addington Circle to a stone bound which is on the side line of said 1930 Town layout of Addington Circle; thence easterly and northeasterly by a 20.00 ft. radius curve, 27.42 ft. to a drill hole in retaining wall; thence N-40°-44°-50"-E, 190.20 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-37°-24'-40"-E, 30.90 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 37.81 ft. to a stone bound which is on the side line of said 1930 Town layout of Addington Circle; thence N-33°-16'-10"-E, 40.34 ft. across Addington Circle to a stone bound which is on the side line of said 1930 Town layout of Addington Circle; thence southeasterly and northeasterly by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 40.73 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-: '0-24'-40"-E, 144.59 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 1050.00 ft, radius curve, 143.66 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-45°-15'-00"-E, 191.43 ft. to a stone bound which is on the Weymouth-Hingham Town Line and on the County line between Norfolk and Plymouth Counties.

The easterly line of Commercial Street begins at a stone bound which is on the northerly line of High Street; said bound being S-69°-55'-30"-E, 98.97 ft. and S-60°-35'-25"-E, 32.39 ft. respectively from the first bound on the westerly line as above described; thence westerly and northerly by a 40.00 ft. radius curve, 54.46 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-17°-24'-40"-T, 247.50 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 1660.00 ft. radius curve, 354.49 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 37.52 ft. to a stone bound which is on the southerly line of Hill Street; thence N-9°-33'-20", 34.37 ft. to a stone bound which is on the northerly line of Hill Street; thence westerly and northerly by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 40.73 ft. to a stone bound; thence $N-4^{\circ}-30^{\circ}-30^{\circ}-E$, 189.67 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 38.98 ft. to a stone bound which is on the southerly side of Hawkins Street; thence N-5°-29'-40"-E, 34.01 ft. to a stone bound, which is on the northerly line of Hawkins Street; thence westerly and northerly by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 39.56 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-4°-30°-30°-E, 70.71 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 292.00 ft. radius curve, 423.82 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-87°-40'-10"-E, 66.86 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 280.00 ft. radius curve, 40.35 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 35.57 ft. to a stone bound which is on the westerly line of Grant Street; thence N-71°-20°-26"-E, 38.00 ft. to a stone bound which is on the easterly line of Grant Street; thence northerly and easterly by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 35.73 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 280.00 ft. radius curve, 150.61 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-32°-00°-11°-E, 210.00 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the left by a 350.00 ft. radius curve, 164.18 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 25.00 ft, radius curve, 34.28 ft, to a stone bound which is on the southerly line of Suwanee Road; thence N-31°-24'-55"-E, 43.11 ft. to a stone bound which is on the northerly line of Suwanee Road; thence westerly and northerly by a 25.00 ft. radius curve, 43.61 ft. to a stone bound; thence H-19°-27'-03"-E, 72.24 ft. to a stone bound; thence continuing on the same course, 205.36 ft. to a stone bound; thence continuing on the same course 141.68 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 877.42 ft. radius curve, 326.13 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-40°-44°-50"-E, 417.69 ft. to a stone bound; thence N-37°-24°-40"-E, 267.10 ft. to a stone bound; thence to the right by a 1000.00 ft. radius curve, 136.81 ft. to a stone bound; thence E-45°-15'-00"-E, 130.29 ft. to a stone bound which is on the Weymouth-Hingham Town Line and on the County line between Norfolk and Plymouth Counties and being S-5°-58'-29"-W, 78.98 ft. from the last bound on the westerly line as above described.

The easterly line heretofore described, in general, between High and Wharf Streets, is 60.00 ft. easterly from and parallel to the westerly line, and between Wharf Street and the Hingham Town Line is 50.00 ft. easterly from and parallel to the westerly line.

And the said Commissioners do hereby take for the purposes of a highway all the easements and rights incident to a public highway in the lands included within the lines of location hereinbefore described, except that portion of land belonging to Consolidated Rail Corporation which is considered their right of way over which lines are established, and the grade thereof is established, all as shown upon a plan entitled "Plan and Profile

showing the Relocation and Widening of Commercial Street, Weymouth, between High Street and the Hingham Town Line, as made by the Norfolk County Commissioners by return dated June 24, 1931.

Howizontal Scale: 1 inch = 40 feet. Vertical Scale: 1 inch = 8 feet.

Alvah L. Downs, County Engineer" and signed by "James J. Collins, Chairman" which plan is filed herewith and made a part of this Return in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 79 of the General Laws and all acts and amendments thereof and in addition thereto.

And the said Commissioners do likewise take temporary easements in Parcels TE-1 through TE-14 inclusive, Parcels TE-16 through TE-33 inclusive and Parcels TE-35 through TE-55 inclusive, as shown on the aforesaid plan, consisting of the right to construct slopes, walls, retaining walls, walks, steps, drives, fences, curbing, railing and remove trees and any other things that may be reasonably necessary to accomplish the purpose of this order of taking, between the lines of said location and the limit of easement as shown on said plan. Said temporary easements to be in effect only until said way is constructed to the full width of the layout as above described and a certificate to that effect has been duly filed by the County Commissioners with their official records.

And permanent stone bounds will be erected at the termini and angles of said way relocated aforesaid.

And it is determined by the Commissioners that all portions of the existing highway, between the termini of this layout lying outside the lines herein established, are hereby discontinued.

And it is determined by the Commissioners that the Inhabitants of the Town of Weymouth do, within two years from the

date of this Return and Order, complete said way in a thorough and workmanlike manner and to the acceptance of the County Commissioners.

The travelled part of said way shall be constructed not less than twenty-six (26) feet in width.

Suitable sidewalks, gutters, culverts, slopes, walls, retaining walls, walks, steps, drives, fences, curbing and railings shall be constructed wherever, in the opinion of the County Commissioners, they are needed.

And it is determined by the Commissioners that all the expense of making the relocation of way prescribed in this Return and Order, including the expense of constructing and maintaining said way, and all land and other damages and expenses incident thereto shall be paid out of the treasury of the Town of WEYMOUTH within fifteen days after demand therefor by any person entitled thereto is made, and should the County be put to any legal expense or any other expense relating to damages, or any further damages be recovered, they shall be paid out of the treasury of said town.

And the said Commissioners have heard the proprietors of lands and property, rights and interest, taken or affected by these proceedings, and have considered and estimated the damages sustained in the premises, having had regard to all the damages done to the parties respectively, whether by taking their property or injuring it in any manner, and having allowed by way of set off, the benefits, if any, to the property of said parties in the premises, and do estimate and determine the damages to be paid to said parties respectively, in the sums hereafter named, in accordance with the requirements of General Laws, Chapter 79, possession becoming effective upon the recording of this Return and Order of Taking in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds.
