RESPECTFULLY REPRESENT YOUR PETITIONERS, inhabitants of the town of Norwood in said County, that common convenience and necessity require that the ways known as Everett Street, American Drive and University Avenue, public ways in said town, be relocated, EVERETT STREET between Blue Star Memorial Highway (Route 1) and a point about 2200 feet easterly, AMERICAN DRIVE throughout its entire length, and UNIVERSITY AVENUE between American Drive and about Station 65 of University Avenue as laid out by the town of Norwood October 27, 1966 for the purpose of (a) Establishing the boundary lines of said ways; (b) Making alterations in the course or width of said ways; (c) Making repairs on said ways

WHEREFORE YOUR PETITIONERS PRAY that said way may be relocated within the limits above specified.

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This petition was presented to the Commissioners and duly entered at a meeting of said Commissioners, held at Dedham, on the fifteenth day of June, 1983, by adjournment of their April meeting next preceding; a notice of said meeting having been posted as required by law; and the twentieth day of July, 1983

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and two-thirty o-clock in the afternoon at the Court House in said Dedham were appointed by said Commissioners as the time and place for commencing and proceeding to view the premises; and they thereupon caused a copy of said petition and of order of notice thereon to be served upon the Clerk of the Town of NORWOOD, heing the town within which such relocation of ways was prayed for, fifteen days at least before the time appointed for said view, and also caused copies of an abstract of said petition and of said order of notice to be posted in two public places in said town: and to be published in the PATRIOT LEDGER, a newspaper published in said County, said posting and publication having been seven days at least before the time and place appointed for said view, that all persons and corporations interested, for or against said petition, might then and there appear and be heard if they saw fit.

And on the said twentieth day of July, 1983 the Commissioners, James J. Collins and George B. McDonald, met at the time and place specified in said Order (David C. Ahearn disqualified by reason of residence) when and where the petitioners appeared and the Town of NORWOOD was represented by its Selectmen; and the said Commissioners then viewed the route and premises, and heard all persons and corporations interested.

And thence the same was continued and adjourned from time to time to a meeting of said Commissioners held at Dedham on the tenth day of August, 1983, a notice of said meeting having been posted as required by law, at which time the said Commissioners did adjudge that common convenience and necessity require that said ways be relocated as prayed for in said petition.

And thence the same was continued and adjourned to a

meeting of said Commissioners held at Dedham on the seventeenth day of August, 1983, a notice of said meeting having been posted as required by law: when and where upon the adjudication aforesaid, the Commissioners appointed the twenty-first day of September, 1983 and two-thirty o'clock in the afternoon at the Court House in said Dedham, as the time and place when they would proceed to and take such action in relation to said adjudication as by law they might be authorized to do.

And having given notice of such adjudication and of the time and place appointed, and for the purpose aforesaid in the same manner as the notice and publication were given and made before first proceeding to view, the Commissioners, James J. Collins and George B. McDonald, met at the time and place appointed and then and there heard all persons and corporations interested and said hearing was continued and adjourned from time to time to this meeting.

And now the Commissioners, James J. Collins and George B. McDonald, by courses and distances, metes and bounds, do relocate a portion of Everett Street, American Drive and a portion of University Avenue as prayed for in said petition.

And the said Commissioners do hereby take for the purposes of a highway all the fee and rights incident to a public highway in the lands included within the lines of location hereinbefore described, all as shown upon a plan entitled "Plan showing the Relocation and Widening of a portion of Everett Street,

American Drive, and a portion of University Avenue, Norwood, as made by the Norfolk County Commissioners by return dated June 6,

1984 Scale: 1 inch = 40 feet. Alvah L. Downs, County Engineer" and signed by "James J. Collins, Chairman" which plan is filed herewith and made a part of this Return in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 79 of the General Laws and all acts and amendments thereof and in addition thereto.

And the said Commissioners do likewise take for the purpose of properly draining said way easements and rights in Parcels

D1 and D2 as indicated on said plan, being more fully described as follows:

And the said Commissioners do likewise further take temporary easements in Parcels TE-1 through TE-16 inclusive and the "15' TEMPORARY EASEMENT" parcels adjacent to Parcels 6 and 9, all as shown on the aforesaid plan, consisting of the right to construct slopes, walls, retaining walls, walks, steps, drives,

fences, curbing, railing and remove trees and any other things that may be reasonably necessary to accomplish the purpose of the order of taking.

And it is likewise determined by the said Commissioners that all the easements acquired by their Return and Order dated March 8, 1955 between the lines of location and the limit of slope as described in said Order are discontinued and the Commissioners do herewith retain and lay out temporary easements between the lines aforesaid, consisting of the rights hereinbefore described for Parcels TE-1 through TE-16 inclusive.

All of said temporary easements are to be in effect only until said way is constructed to the full width of the layout and a certificate to that effect has been duly filed and recorded by the County Commissioners.

Parcels 6 and 9, together with the adjacent 15' temporary easements, are taken in accordance with Chapter 79 of the General Laws, and all acts and amendments thereof and in addition thereto and as further authorized by Chapter 712 of the Acts of 1983 entitled: An Act authorizing the Town of Norwood and the County Commissioners of Norfolk County to relocate and construct an extension of University Avenue in the Town of Norwood.

And permanent stone bounds will be erected at the termini and angles of said ways relocated aforesaid.

And it is determined by the Commissioners that all portions of the existing highways, between the termini of this lay-out lying outside the lines herein established (Parcel 13), are hereby discontinued.

And it is determined by the Commissioners that the Inhab-

itants of the Town of NORWOOD do, within five years from the date of this Return and Order, complete said ways in a thorough and work-manlike manner and to the acceptance of the County Commissioners.

The travelled part of said ways shall be constructed not less than thirty-six (36) feet in width.

Suitable sidewalks, gutters, culverts, slopes, walls, retaining walls, walks, steps, drives, fences, curbing and railings shall be constructed wherever, in the opinion of the County Commissioners, they are needed.

And it is determined by the Commissioners that all the expense of making the relocation of ways prescribed in this Return and Order, including the expense of constructing and maintaining said ways, and all land and other damages and expenses incident thereto shall be paid out of the treasury of the Town of NORWOOD, and should the County be put to any legal expense or any other expense relating to damages, or any further damages be recovered, they shall be paid out of the treasury of said town.

And the said Commissioners have heard the proprietors of lands and property, rights and interest, taken or affected by these proceedings, and have considered and estimated the damages sustained in the premises, having had regard to all the damages done to the parties respectively, whether by taking their property or injuring it in any manner, and having allowed by way of set off, the benefits, if any, to the property of said parties in the premises, and do estimate and determine the damages to be paid to said parties respectively, in the sums hereafter named, in accordance with the requirements of General Laws, Chapter 79, possession becoming effective upon the recording of this Return and Order of Taking in the Norfolk Registry of Deeds.
