

To the County Commissioners of the County
of Norfolk in the Commonwealth of
Massachusetts:—

Whereas the Dighton and Somerset Railroad
Company, a corporation duly established by law,
was by an Act of the Legislature of said
Commonwealth, entitled "An Act in addition
to an Act to incorporate the Dighton & Somerset
Railroad Company", approved March 17, 1864,
authorized to locate, construct and operate its
Railroad, as set forth in said Act:—

And Whereas the Railroad of said Company
has been duly located in conformity with
said Act:—

Now therefore in pursuance of said Act and
of the General Statutes of said Commonwealth,
the said Dighton and Somerset Railroad Company
do hereby file with the said County Commissioners
the following as that portion of the Location of
their said Railroad within said County, the
same defining the courses, distances and
boundaries of such portion thereof within said
County, as required by law.

The said Location within said County and the
courses, distances and boundaries thereof are
defined, contained and appear upon the Plan
hereto annexed signed by E. H. Winslow, Engineer,
and A. Savary, Delinicator, and entitled, "A Plan
of the Location of the Dighton and Somerset

Railroad in the Towns of Braintree, Randolph and Stoughton within the County of Norfolk, 10th March 1863rd, which said Plan with all the Explanations, directions, courses, words, lines, letters, figures and Characters therein are made part hereof and may be referred to as such, the red or base line on said Plan being a line drawn through the Centre or middle of the track of said Railroad.

The said Location within said County and the courses, distances and boundaries thereof are fully written out, defined and described in the manner following, that is to say:—

The said Location in the Town of Braintree in said County of Norfolk is describe as follows:—

Commencing at a stone monument on the westerly line of the Location of the Old Colony & Newport Railway Company, Easterly of & thirty three feet from the centre line of the Location of the Dighton & Somerset Railroad at land of John Holbrook, the Easterly line of said Location of said Dighton & Somerset Railroad, runs South westerly curving westerly with a radius of five thousand seven hundred & sixty two $\frac{6}{10}$ feet parallel to and thirty three feet from said centre line by land of said Holbrook three hundred & ten feet and by land of Caleb S. Holbrook

thirteen hundred and ninety feet to a stone monument — thence in a straight line Westward, parallel to and thirty three feet from, said Centre line by land of said Caleb S. Holbrook sixty six feet to the centre of the Cochato River which is the boundary line between said Town of Waintree and the Town of Randolph — thence turning and running Northward (here leaving the Eastward line of said location) on said boundary line across said location, sixty six ^{feet} to a point on the Westward line of said location thirty three feet from said Centre line.

At which last named point commencing, the Westward line of said location runs in a straight line Eastward parallel to, and thirty three feet from said Centre line by land of said Caleb S.
