KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,

that the Plainville Cemetery Association, a Corporation duly established by law and located in WRENTHAM, Village of Plainville, county of Norfolk and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of one hundred dollars, paid by the Inhabitants of the Town of North Attleborough, a municipal corporation located in the county of Bristol and said Commonwealth, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Inhabitants of the Town of North Attleborough, their successors and assigns, the right to carry and conduct under the following described strip of land, and therein to construct and forever maintain, an underground main water conduit, or line of water pipe, with underground appurtenances and such gates or valves as may be necessary, and to repair and renew the same, to wit:- The main Avenue of the Plainville Cemetery situated in said Plainville and running southerly from West Bacon street to Wetherell's Pond, said Avenue being of the width of twenty (20) feet, as shown on a plan drawn by F.C. Fuller, Civil Engineer, to be filed for record herewith. It is understood and agreed that whenever said Town of North Attleborough shall enter upon and dig up said avenue, either for the purpose of laying said water conduit, or for the purpose of repairing or renewing the same, or for any other purpose, the work shall be carried on with all reasonable despatch, and at the conclusion of said work said avenue shall be left in as good and safe a condition as it was before said Town of North Attleborough entered upon said premises.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said easements and privileges to the said Inhabitants of the Town of North Attleborough, their successors and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the said Plainville Cemetery Association has caused these presents to be signed in its name and behalf by Frank I. Barden, its President, hereto duly authorized, and its seal to be hereto affixed, this third day of October in the year one thousand nine hundred and four.

At a meeting of the Plainville Cemetery Association, legally called and duly held on the twenty sixth day of September 1904, upon motion duly made & seconded, it was VOTED: that the President be authorized to execute, acknowledge and deliver, a deed from the Association to the town of North Attleborough, conveying the right to lay and maintain a water conduit through the
