I, William S. Metcalf (widower) of Plainville, Norfolk County, Massachusetts marked "W.S.M. 3/16/1925." for consideration paid, grant to the

Inhabitants of the Town of Plainville in said County of Norfolk with QUITY CLAIM COVENANTS the land in said PLAINVILLE consisting of a certain lot or parcel with the buildings thereon situated on the westerly side of South Street, bounded and described as follows, viz: beginning at a point in the westerly line of said South Street, it being the southeasterly corner of land of one Robert E. MacNeill; thence westerly bounded northerly by said MacNeill's land four hundred thirty one and eighty one hundredths (431.81) feet to a stone wall and a corner; thence northerly by a stone wall bounded easterly by said MacNeill's land one hundred nineteen and six tenths (119.6) feet to a corner of wall and other land of the grantor; thence westerly bounded northerly by said grantor's land two hundred seventy four and twenty-five hundredths (274.25) feet, more or less, to the Ten Mile River, the last described line being a continuation of said MacNeill's northerly line; thence in a general southeasterly direction bounded by said Ten Mile River and the Bacons Pond, so called, to land formerly of one Reed; thence easterly bounded southerly by said Reed land two hundred seventy-seven and eight tenths (277.8) feet more or less to the aforesaid South Street; thence northerly bounded easterly by said South Street two hundred twenty-seven and two tenths (227.2) feet to an angle; thence deflecting to the East by an angle of one (1) degree and seventeen (17) minutes still bounded easterly by said South Street one hundred thirty
